# Teaching Excellence at Navitas Limited

What is the Teaching Excellence at Navitas initiative?

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# The Modules

#### **FACILITATING STUDENT LEARNING**

#### **Teaching in the Navitas Context**

#### Dates: August 22 - September 5 | September 12 - 26

Instructors explore learning and teaching at Navitas, with specific attention to our Canadian colleges. Activities will encourage instructors to think about their own teaching style and analyze how this – and the teaching styles of others in the course – aligns with the Navitas teaching context and values.

#### **Curriculum Conversation Kit**

#### Dates: Available upon request by your college

Traditionally a face-to-face workshop, this module focuses on instructors critically analyzing each element of their course prior to their first semester teaching with the Moodle learning management system.

# **Creating Accessible Learning Opportunities**

#### **Dates: Available early 2023**

Instructors will discuss the importance of creating accessible learning opportunities when teaching across a range of modalities (in-person, blended or fully remote). Instructors will review several approaches to equip students with technology skills and provide equitable access to students whilst identifying strategies and processes to create unit materials and tasks that meet accessibility requirements.

#### **DESIGNING AND PLANNING CURRICULUM**

# **Designing Active Learning**

Dates: November 7 - 21

Instructors collaborate with educators to unravel active learning principles within higher education. Instructors will explore strategies that can be used to incorporate active learning into the classroom while ensuring that informed pedagogy is driving the activity design process.

#### **Designing Lesson Plans**

Dates: October 17 - 31

Instructors will explore the benefits of lesson planning and look at common features of good lesson plan design.

## **Designing for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion**

Dates: October 3 - 17

Instructors will explore learning and teaching strategies that incorporate diversity and inclusion principles. At the end of the module, instructors will consider how these strategies apply to their teaching, and critically reflect on how to further implement these into their teaching practice.

# **ENHANCING ASSESSMENT AND FEEDBACK**

## **Developing Learning-Focused Feedback Strategies**

Dates: December 5 - 19

Instructors examine how to provide students with meaningful feedback that will help improve their assessment performance and enhance learning.

# **Nurturing Self-Regulated Learning in Students**

**Dates: Available early 2023** 

Instructors will examine key components of self-regulated learning in the context of higher education and develop strategies to support students in becoming more skillful self-regulated learners.

# REFLECTING ON TEACHING PRACTICE (CAPSTONE CERTIFICATE)

#### **Reflecting on Teaching Practice**

Instructors will examine how to reflect on learning and teaching practices through established models and frameworks. At the end of the module, instructors will apply what they have learned by identifying a significant teaching event and reflecting on it from several different perspectives, with the intention of generating new ways of approaching their learning and teaching practice.
